2026 8th International Conference on Tainan Area Studies Tradition and Innovation: Tainan City's Industrial and Regional Development

Call for Papers

1. Objectives:

Tainan City lies between the Bazhang River and the Erren River, geographically divided into the Alishan front range colline zone, Chiayi-Tainan Plain, and coastal lagoons. Its industrial development has always been centered around the primary sector, which is closely tied to the land. As for the secondary sector, manufacturing industries started to emerge during the Qing Dynasty, with sugar production playing an important role in rural areas. During the mid-Japanese colonial period, improved water resource management of Chianan Irrigation reshaped the agricultural sector. Industrial developments such as modernized sugar production, industrial salt production, chemical plants and oil field operations further strengthened Tainan's internal and external connections. Since the post-war period, traditional industries such as textiles, toys, machinery, and food processing have begun to flourish, and numerous industrial parks have been built. In 1996, the Southern Taiwan Science Park was established, straddling Anding District, Shanhua District and Xinshi District. The science park has steered Tainan City towards the development of high-tech industries, leading to industrial upgrading, increased job opportunities, and economic growth.

However, Tainan's agriculture and rural areas faced challenges such as population ageing and shortage of labor. The "One Town One Product" project supported by the Ministry of Economic Affairs spurred many townships to develop industries with local characteristics through the primary sector, while also introducing tourism and cultural revitalization. The development of Tainan's historic districts has also become part of the culture industry, imbuing tourism and cultural development with new life and vitality. Today, Tainan has over 400 years of history and culture. Numerous historic sites in the urban area have been turned into museums, and the city's temple culture has reshaped the tourism industry. Even the renovation of cultural and historical spaces in the former Tainan County has become a symbol of regional revitalization and cultural regeneration. The local expression of art and culture accelerates the development of local tourism.

As industrial development contributes to the diversity of Tainan City, this year's International Conference on Tainan Area Studies aims to study the evolution of Tainan's primary, secondary, and tertiary sectors, as well as their impact on the city's socioeconomic and historical development. Through the lens of tradition and innovation, we will also explore the dynamics and spatial connections between the industries and regions. Focusing on industry classification and regional development, this conference invites papers on the following subtopics. We look forward to your submissions and participation.

9. Paper Format:

- (1) Please use A4 paper size and standard Word format.
- (2) The first page should include the following items: Chinese title, author's name, the abstract (350 words in English or 500 words in Chinese), and a maximum of 5 keywords.
- (3) Please use DFKai-SB (標楷體) for Chinese text and Times New Roman for English text. Title: 18 points and bold; headings (such as Abstract, Chapter, Conclusion): 14 points and bold; main text: 12 points.

(4) Approved word count of the whole paper is 15,000-25,000 words or between 8,000-10,000 words for English papers. Manuscripts should follow the formatting guidelines outlined in the Taiwan Historical Research (THR) style sheet.

10. Submission and Review Method:

- (1) Abstract submissions are open until December 31, 2025. Please fill out the form with a tentative paper title, a 350-word abstract (English) or a 500-word abstract (Chinese), five keywords, and personal information, and email it to the organizer.

- (3) After receiving the submission, the Conference will form a planning committee to conduct a preliminary review and then notify the contributor of the results.
- (4) After the conference, the presenters are invited to submit their revised paper to be included in a peer reviewed edited volume of the Tainan Studies book series.
